Fear of death ^[14], He could only be roused by speaking loudly ^[7], The headache lasted from noon till bedtime, when in bed, but returned at 10 o'clock next day, When wrinkling the skin of the forehead, pain in the right orbit ^[7], Frightened by irregular action of heart ^[5], Fearful time with her heart palpitating and feeling as if she should die ^[5].

Head
