- Direct contact with the mouth, anus, penis, or vagina of a person infected with HPV.
- Multiple sex partners
- Immune system that is compromised by illness or medication

Case Study Gender: Male Age: 30 Years

Outcome

By March 2025, full recovery from anal warts, fissures, and secondary syphilis was achieved. The lesions healed without scarring, and there was no relapse. Along with physical recovery, his confidence improved, and he resumed his normal work life comfortably.
